


Connect to the rest of the country and beyond

With ongoing investment into Cornwall’s roads, London only an hour by plane and 4.5 hours by train, and regular air services to Manchester, Newcastle and Liverpool, Cornwall’s solid transport infrastructure will connect you to the rest of the country and beyond.

AIR: One of the fastest growing UK regional airports, Newquay Cornwall Airport (www.newquaycornwallairport.com) provides daily flights to London and the Isles of Scilly, services to Manchester, Newcastle and Liverpool, and charters to Europe.

RAIL: First Great Western (www.firstgreatwestern.co.uk) and Cross Country (www.crosscountrytrains.co.uk) rail services from Cornwall to destinations across the UK, as well as the popular overnight sleeper trains.

Funding Opportunities

Whether you want to undertake research, prototype a new product, take on new members of staff or apprentices or make a capital investment, there is a good range of regular funding opportunities available to business in Cornwall.

Cornwall has recently secured £500 million of European Regional Development funding, £60 million of which has been allocated for business grants, loans and financial incentives which is anticipated to be available from the fourth quarter of 2015.

In addition, new funding opportunities are announced all the time – recent funds have included £2 million for marine renewable device developers and €1.46 billion worth of grant funding for the creative and cultural sector through Creative Europe between now and 2020.


